4-H is the youth education program of Colorado State University Cooperative Extension. It's for boys and girls who are ages 8 to 18 by January 1 of the current year.

4-H even offers the *Cloverbud* program for youth ages 5–7.

Crowley County has two 4-H clubs with kids just like you. They live in towns, on farms and in rural areas. Wherever you live, whatever you like to do . . . 4-H is for you.

You can even start your own club. You just need four friends and one adult who will help you get started.

4-H Cost is \$20.00 per year plus literature costs. You will also receive a monthly newsletter with 4-H happenings in the state, district and county.
