Parliamentary Procedure

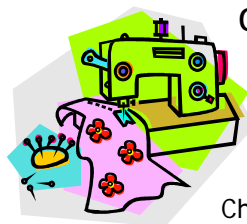

The contest is open to all 4-H clubs and other 4-H groups who can field a five person parliamentary procedure team. The contest consists of three parts, a written test, a meeting demonstration, and oral questions. This year's Champion team is the El Paso County Youth Leaders. The winning team members were Emily Archuleta from Trailblazers 4-H Club who was the acting president for the contest, Amanda Watson from 4-H Wildcats, Weston Doyle from High Country Kids, Zac Abushaban from Woodman Valley 4-H, and CJ Bilodeau from Falcon Ranchers. The winning team was coached by Jonathan Vrabec. The Reserve Champion team from the Barbwire N' Boots 4-H club was represented by Rebecca Jones, acting president for the contest, Courtney Schmidt, Emily McCaffery, Sarah Schmidt, and Michael McBride. The winning team plus Rebecca Jones will represent El Paso County at the Colorado State 4-H Conference in Fort Collins in June where they hope to then qualify for the National 4-H Western Round-up Parliamentary Procedure Contest, January 2010 in Denver. Important Levels Testing Information!

Levels 3 & 4 Written Test Taking Opportunity

Jonathan will offer those interested in taking Levels 3 & 4 written tests two more opportunities in June once on June 3rd at the Extension Office at 6:00 p.m. and the last time will be on June 30th during the County Council meeting at KCRC at 7:00 p.m. Please email Jonathan at jonathanvrabec@elpasoco.com to make arrangements.

Levels 2, 3 & 4 Riding Test- At this time of the year you must make your own arrangements with a levels tester to set up riding tests for these levels. There will not be anymore county organized riding test offered. Please visit <http://equineextension.colostate.edu/> and follow the link to advancement levels where you will find a list and contact information for all state certified levels testers.

Horse Members Remember

Do not forget to be eligible to show at the County Fair you must have shown the project horse in a class and taken the written test at least once during the show season at an Advisory Committee sanctioned 4-H horse show. NOTE: Showing at a "closed show" that was open only to those in the member's club does not qualify a member to register for the County Fair 4-H Horse Show, even though it was sufficient for project completion. If a member wishes to show a second project horse at County Fair, it must have been used in at least one class at an Advisory Committee sanctioned 4-H horse show.

Living with Livestock

Showmanship/Fitting Clinics

We will be holding a Swine, Sheep, and Beef showmanship and fitting clinic and now a Goat showmanship clinic and grooming for Dairy, Pygmy and Market Goats has been added on June 20th at 9:00 am at the Fairgrounds. This is a hands on clinic for steers and market lambs so bring your animals and fitting supplies/equipment to get credit for attending. If you are attending the swine clinic you will not need to bring your animals. There will be animals there that will be used for demonstration purposes. Aaron Volosin will be doing the Beef Showmanship and Fitting, Tom & Cathy Myers will be doing the Sheep Fitting and Showmanship and the swine clinician is yet to be determined. This clinic will be the last clinic to count towards your clinic requirements. You will only be able to satisfy one clinic requirement during these clinics on the 20th as you will spend the entire 2 hours learning about one specific species and will not be able to jump around from species clinic to another. This is in hope that you will get more out of the clinics on one species.



Discounted Health Certificate Day June 27

A Health Certificate Day will be held at Terry Shaw's house on June 27th from 8 am until noon. All species are welcome (cattle, sheep, goats and swine). They will not do pseudo rabies testing on hogs, only health certificates. There will be a small fee for this service of \$2 per head. Airway Veterinary Hospital will be doing the health checks. Please call Terry Shaw at 683-3712. Terry's house is located off of Ellicott Hwy at 6930 Ellicott Hwy.

Steer Hoof Trimming June 27

A steer hoof trimming on June 27th at Terry Shaw's house at the same time as the Discounted Health Certificate opportunity. Hoof trimming will take place from 9 am - noon. The hoof trimming is for anyone in the beef project. There will be a \$20 charge for this service so please be prepared to pay at the time of service. See the article in this newsletter regarding the Discounted Health Certificates for Terry's address and phone.

Pork Quality Assurance Recertifying Procedures

In order to renew your PQA certification the youth will need to come to the Extension Office and take a written test. They must pass the test with a 70%. If they do not pass with a 70% they may attempt to test out once more. If the two tests yield unsuccessful results, then the youth must attend an MQA class prior to being recertified. Tests will be graded once a week and you will be notified of the results. Again this is only for those renewing their PQA certification all initial PQA certifications are accomplished by attending an MQA Workshop.

Health Certificates

All Livestock (goats, sheep, hogs and cattle) Exhibited at the El Paso County Fair must be accompanied by an official health certificate individually identifying each animal issued within 30 days before the weigh-in at fair. All Exhibitors should contact their local Vet to obtain the required health certificate. Furthermore, All Swine must originate in herds not known to be infected with pseudo rabies and be accompanied with health certificates. Pseudo rabies tests are NOT required on swine as long as they originate from a free heard. Please check the El Paso County Fair Livestock Premium List for more specifics.

Participate in Catch-A Lamb!!

It's time to start thinking about participating in the Catch-it Programs at our County Fair. You start the process by filling out an application. Horse and Livestock



All Animal Record Books

Small Animal, Horse and Livestock Record books are due to the extension office graded from the club/project leaders on September 14th. Your club/project leaders will require you to hand the books into them at an earlier date so that they have time to grade them, before handing them in to the office. I would like clubs to hand their books in together so please do not bring your book into the extension office and drop it off. It will only be accepted from your club or project leader. Ungraded books will also not be accepted. Leaders please grade all books as having the feedback to your members assists in the learning process.

With the new online record books I have been receiving some questions regarding how many books need to be filled out. The policy has NOT changed and is the same as the last several years. ONLY put one project per book (in other words you put both your market sheep in one book and put your breeding sheep in a separate book and put your market swine in a different book). Do not put everything in one book it causes difficulty when grading. They must be separated by project areas (i.e. breeding and Market are different project areas as is species). Remember for some projects a supplement is required and is also available on the web site. Also you may find it helpful to also download the Record Users Guide for Livestock/Horse e-Records also available at the same site and location as the record books are. It will have helpful information you can use to assist you in filling the books out.

Leaders when you get questions please refer to the Organizational Leaders Handbook and review the Record Book Policy. Score sheets are posted for horse and livestock on our county web site. Small animal project score sheets will be posted soon. We will notify you as soon as possible once they are finished.
