SHEAVES & VINES

Sheave of small grain, grasses and Proso millet shall be at least 3" in diameter at the center tie. Sheaves or bundles of sorghum, sudan grass, alfalfa, and clover shall be at least 6" in diameter at the center tie. Sheaves shall be cured, arranged and appropriately mounted on a hard board.

SUGAR BEETS

Beet should be topped by trimming at the crown just below the leaf petiole but not too far into the root. Beet should be free from soil.
