If handwritten, use dark pencil or ink (needs to be dark enough to photocopy).

If typed or computer printed, please type double space using 14 pt. font.

Include following with Entry:

1. Picture of you wearing outfit and accessories Or picture of outfit with accessories.
2. Copy of pattern envelope (clothing construction) or copy of pattern (artistic clothing)
3. Clothing Construction: include a 3" x 3" sample of fabric(s) used in outfit.

You can submit narrative and other materials using one of the following:

1. Printed copy attached with this entry form by mail, in person, or by FAX to Extension Center
2. On a Computer Disc in a WORD file **along with a printed copy** attached to this entry form by mail or in person to Extension Center.

Entry form with your narrative and other required information is due by **Wednesday, July 15.**

Provide the following information with your name and project on each page and fastened securely to the narrative page.

1. Picture of you wearing outfit and accessories Or picture of outfit with accessories.
2. Clothing Construction - include a copy of pattern envelope AND a 3" x 3" sample of fabric(s) used in outfit
3. Artistic Clothing - include a copy of pattern or design if a commercial pattern or kit was used

Writing Your Fashion Revue Narrative:

Use the following questions as a guide for including information about you and your project. **Use SOME of the following questions - you DO NOT have to include information for all questions.** See "Tips for Writing Fashion Revue Narrative" on the back side of this sheet along with the sample narrative.

1. Start narrative with name someplace in the first sentence.
2. What grade will you be in this fall and what school do you attend?
3. Does your outfit have any special design features (i.e. collar, pocket, etc.) ? If so, briefly tell what they are.
4. What fabric did you use? Is there any special weave, color, design?
5. How do the accessories you selected compliment the outfit, such as coordinating socks, shoes, matching hair ties, earrings, etc.? Why did you pick these?
6. Where will you wear this outfit - school, special events, etc.?
7. What did you like best about completing this outfit?
8. What new thing(s) did you learn? What problems did you overcome to complete the project?

"TIPS FOR WRITING FASHION REVUE NARRATIVES"

1. The narrative sets the mood for the audience. The 2009 Fashion Revue theme is **"Fashion Home Run"**. Try to include the theme in part of the script as you write the narrative. Example: "Corey's new outfit will be perfect for celebrating at the local softball tournament. "
2. Use your name and "she/he" or "his/her" in the narrative rather than "I". Remember, the narrative will be read by someone else telling about you as you model.
3. Don't state the obvious. Rather than say "Corey's shorts are blue,." try "Corey's sky blue shorts will be cool to wear during hot summer days. "
4. **Do a rough draft of your narrative.**
 - * **DON'T** write too much.
 - * Ages 8, 9 and 10 - your narrative should be **NO longer** than 30 seconds.
 - * Older youths' narratives can be a little longer but practice and time it while reading out loud.
 - * After you complete this draft, put it aside for a day. The next day read it again.
 - * At that time you may want to make changes. Check for complete sentences and correct spelling. Have someone else read it to see if they understand what you say.
5. Keep a copy of this narrative. Before Fashion Revue, use it to practice modeling.
6. If your accessories change after you turn it in, let us know during practice on July 22 so we can correct the narrative. If you make changes after July 22, email corrections to Luann (luann.boyer@colostate.edu) or call her at 542-3544.

NOTE: The Fashion Revue committee may edit your narrative for clarity and readability.

SAMPLE NARRATIVE

Corey Adams is a third year member this year and decided to try an outfit which had several new skills. Corey likes the waffle cloth fabric which is perfect for summertime. Corey likes to sew and even though there were problems with the zipper, with grandmother's help it was easy to finish. Since blue is Corey's favorite color, there was no problem deciding on the fabric, especially since it is wash and wear. Corey picked the print pullover top to complete the outfit because the print matches perfectly. The outfit is completed with blue canvas sport shoes - a good choice for a night at the ballgame.
