SUMMIT COUNTY 4-H EXPECTATIONS & GOALS

CODE OF CONDUCT

All 4-H members, leaders, and clubs are expected to abide by the Colorado 4-H Code of Conduct. The 4-H Code of Conduct is listed on your 4-H Enrollment Form and on our Summit County 4-H web site.

MEMBER & CLUB COMMITMENT

4-H Members are expected to participate in all or most of the 4-H Project Club meetings throughout the year. When a child misses several classes, it is difficult for them to “catch up” to where the rest of the club is at on their 4-H projects. 4-H Leaders and Clubs are more productive and effective when their 4-H Members are all working at the same stage on their projects.

4-H RECORD BOOKS

All 4-H Members are required to complete 4-H Record Books for each one of their chosen project(s). Parents are encouraged to help your child complete their 4-H Record Books throughout the year. 4-H Record Books are listed on our Summit County 4-H web site and the State/CSU 4-H web site. Your 4-H Leader will also assist 4-H Members on completing their 4-H Record Books

4-H/MOUNTAIN COMMUNITY FAIR

All 4-H Members are expected to participate in our annual Mountain Community Fair in July. All 4-H Record Books and 4-H Projects are to be completed for entry into our Fair. Our Fair provides important positive recognition and feedback for increased educational opportunities for 4-H Members to learn life-skills by their participation. Summit County 4-H sponsors the 4-H Exhibit Tent, 4-H Horse Shows, 4-H Dog Show, & 4-H Rocket Launch where our 4-H kids show off what they have learned in their 4-H Clubs throughout the year. For 4-H Members and Clubs that don't have a “project” i.e. Fly Fishing, Shooting Sports, and Dog Therapy, children are expected to make a poster/photos related to their 4-H experience. Please ask your 4-H Leader for assistance in creating a 4-H poster for the Fair to represent what they have learned in their 4-H Club this year.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

All 4-H Members are expected to participate in at least one **Community Service Project** hosted by Summit County 4-H each year. Many of our 4-H clubs host different community service projects throughout the year—all 4-H members are encouraged to participate. Community Service projects are listed in our weekly “4-H Upcoming” emails and posted to our 4-H web site.

4-H CLUB GOALS

- 1.) Make sure all kids are enrolled in 4-H
- 2.) Recite 4-H Pledge at beginning of each club meeting
- 3.) Have kids fill out sign-in sheet at meetings
- 4.) Help kids complete Record Books (located on 4-H web site)
- 5.) Encourage kids to complete and enter their 4-H project into MCFair
For clubs without projects, please help kids complete a poster (shooting sports, dog therapy, fly fishing, etc.)
- 6.) Use 4-H Manual where appropriate (ordered thru CSU via Kathie)
- 7.) Follow State 4-H Guidelines for projects where appropriate (4-H web site)
- 8.) Encourage kids to do a simple Demonstration in a club meeting
- 9.) Encourage kids to participate in a 4-H Community Service project
- 10.) Keep your club open to all—no discrimination
- 11.) Make sure kids and leaders are having FUN!
- 12.) Keep updated on local and State 4-H programs by visiting web sites on a regular basis.
